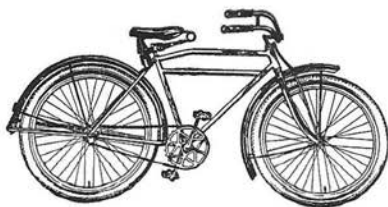

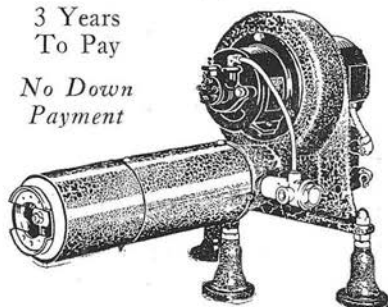

In this class horses will be judged in taking the jumps according to the following scale of demerits.

- (b) A touch with the fore limbs without knocking down bar..... 1 fault
- (c) Knocking down bar with hind limbs..... 2 faults
- (d) Knocking down bar with fore limbs..... 3 faults
- (e) Horse or rider or horse and rider falling..... 4 faults
- (f) First refusal or bolting..... 1 fault
- (g) Second refusal or bolting 2 faults
- (h) Third refusal or bolting.....Debarred

Each contestant will enter the ring alone and be given a pointless javelin. At the command of the ringmaster the contestant will canter toward the targets and throw the javelin at them, from any point out-side of a marked square. The contestant will then go to the foot of the ring and secure a second javelin and repeat, cantering toward the head of the ring. The contestant will then go to one side of the ring for a third javelin, and repeat. Once signalled to start, having been given a javelin, a contestant may not go out of canter till he or she has thrown the javelin. Hitting small target counts 6, middle-sized target 4, and large target 2.
