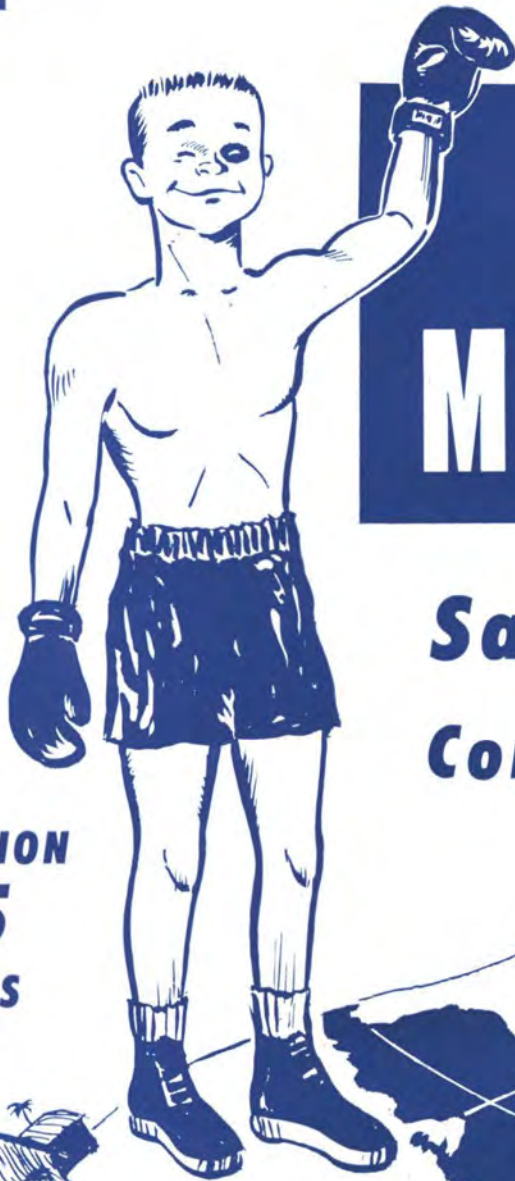

Former Aquinas Mission Moderator Honored

Success in most any field calls for unflagging dedication. Among us tonight we have a splendid example in Rev. Arthur Looby, the man who elevated the Mission Bouts to its present high status of one of the best nights on the city's sports scene.

Father Looby no longer is at Aquinas nor is he any longer connected with the Mission Bouts he loved so well. Last summer he was transferred to St. Thomas High School in Houston, Tex. But a transfer doesn't remove memories.

So just by way of showing Father Looby that Aquinas has not forgotten or minimized his long, devoted effort of raising money for the Missions, he will be presented a special plaque for outstanding work for Missions tonight.

The story of his great work at Aquinas needs no coloring up or empty accolades that are merely mouthed with little meaning behind them.

He took over as head of the Missions in 1949, and a part of the duty was staging the Mission Bouts which he promoted in strictly big league fashion.

Under his guidance, the Mission Bouts steadily grew to a point where last year the bouts were performed before a sellout crowd at the Sports Arena. He instituted the idea of the strict training program for the fighters.

The bouts were only part of his drive for the Missions. He organized student medicine drives, student representative trips to Missions in

Texas, student attendance for Mass for Missions, invited Bishop Fulton J. Sheen to address the students on Missions.

The fruit of his work was that Aquinas reached a point where it is now regarded throughout the nation as one of the best friends the Missions ever had.

All the while, he was making pointed, helpful improvements for the Mission Bouts finals program. Things like a new ring, head gears, sweaters for student officials, robes for fighters and the like. Even a veteran fight promoter like Norm Rothschild from Syracuse expressed amazement at the skill in which Father Looby promoted his Mission Bouts card.

All of which gets around to why Father Looby is getting this plaque tonight. There's little material value to a plaque. But receiving it could be one of the memorable moments of Father Looby's work with the Missions. He's that kind of man.

Catholic Fighter of the Year

BASILIAN HONOR BASILIO

Three years after he had decided that he wanted to make his living by boxing, Carmen Basilio became so discouraged that he quit the ring to work in an electrical factory.

This is only one chapter of the heartbreak the Clouter from Chittenango has known. So it's little wonder that a pleased look comes into his eyes beneath those battle-scared brows when you greet him with "Hi ya champ."

The 28-year-old ring roughie, who at the age of seven was working on an onion farm, has held the welterweight boxing title of the world for more than six months. He earned the right to that distinction by coming out on top of two blood-drenched fights with tough Tony DeMarco, the two title scraps having been held within five months.

But the road to the title was broken and bumpy. There was the time he quit the ring. Then he was the victim of mismanagement. And when he finally hit a stride where he was a top contender, he was by-passed for title fights so often that he was being compared to the bridesmaid who just couldn't seem to get the traditional flower toss from the bride.

All this is behind him now. He's become a real home-grown area celebrity, kept busy fulfilling engagements like tonight's appearance at the Mission Bouts where he will receive a plaque designating him as the Catholic Fighter of the Year. He has a deep pride, respect and duty toward his station as the welter king of the world. He conducts himself like a gentleman out of the ring. Once the bell rings, though, he's a killer on the prowl.

In describing why Basilio was chosen for tonight's award, Father John Wilson, moderator of the Mission Bouts, explained, "Carmen was a guest at our Mission Bouts last year, and he was wonderful to all of us. He's proved a great inspiration to our boys. He's always in shape and has a tremendous determination to keep the title. He's an exemplary Catholic, and I don't just mean one who blesses himself in the corner of a ring before a fight."

Carmen will tell you that he likes being champ and that he means to remain one. That might come as distressing news to Johnny Saxton against whom he will defend his title on March 14 at Chicago.

Basilio last was a Rochester visitor on Jan. 16 when he attended the Press-Radio Polio Fund Dinner. He had hoped that he might have been voted the much-prized Hickok Belt.

When he found out that Otto Graham was going to win the award, he said simply, "When I saw Otto play his last game, I knew he had it won. Nobody deserved it more."

But in his own field of boxing, it's a different story. When someone asked Carmen who he thought was the best boxer in the business, he answered with a nice mixture of confidence and comedy, "Me."

Mission Bouts Effects Reach 'round the World

If you were one of those countless thousands of people who wandered among the booths of the Mission Scenerama last October at the Community War Memorial, you would have found great respect for the Aquinas Mission Bouts.

Mission Scenerama graphically explained what great good the money raised through mission drives can accomplish. The Aquinas Mission Bouts, of course, long ago has arrived as one of the nation's stablest contributors to Catholic Misisions.

Take last year, for example, when the Aquinas Mission drive came up with a record \$26,954.09 contribution. That was the last drive directed by the Rev. Arthur Looby who since was transferred to St. Thomas High School in Houston, Texas.

Now the Rev. John Wilson is the moderator of the bouts. Seizing the competitive whip, Father Wilson has gone on record as saying, "We have set before our boys the holy ambition of trying to surpass or at least to equal the great contribution record set by Father Looby."

What happens to the money raised by these bouts? A fair question and one always in order in any charity drive.

Well, in recent years Aquinas has managed

to maintain more than a \$20,000 average annual contribution to missions.

Far-off places such as Pakistan, Formosa, India, Africa, South America and the Arctics are some of the beneficiaries.

Aquinas boys have maintained a personal contact with missionaries, and this, too, has helped to keep alive their strong spirit. Aquinas is directed by the Basilian Fathers who also have charge of missions for Mexicans in the state of Texas.

The Mission Bouts have built six churches in Texas, rectories for missionaries, two medical clinics, a chapel in Pakistan and a mission church in the Arctics.

There are also huge contributions to the Society for the Propagation of the Faith annually. On Mission Day in 1953, Bishop Fulton J. Sheen, national director for the Propagation of the Faith, addressed the Aquinas student body.

Father Wilson says: "We find that the Mission Bouts go over as well as they do chiefly because they are for the missions. Everyone pitches in and does his bit. When it's for the missions, it goes over. The whole program has the effect of training the boys to become conscious of the Church's problems."

Aquinas Honors An Old Friend

At an informal luncheon last summer, Father Cy Carter, Aquinas' director of athletics, once summed up Abe Raff perfectly.

"What better tribute could be paid this man than to say that here's a man of the Jewish faith who has given so unselfishly of himself for so many years so that Catholic Missions might benefit," Father Cy said.

For 17 years little Abe was one of the strong guiding hands behind the Mission Bouts. But this

year illness reduced him to an advisory capacity.

Appropriately, Aquinas has chosen this night to award Abe a plaque for his long, outstanding work with the Mission Bouts.

The onetime Western New York bantam and featherweight boxing champ turned haberdasher authored the code upon which the Mission Bouts operate.

He believes that a program of this type should be strictly a clinic to teach youngsters the art of self-defense and the benefits of strong, sound bodies. He believes every boy should be taught the art of losing as well as the art of winning.

"We don't try to turn out great fighters," Abe says. "We just want to turn out boys who will make good in life, be able to handle themselves and maybe get a college scholarship."

Like so many others who help make the Mission Bouts a huge success, Abe's services always have been donated.

Trophy for Dick Tierney

For two straight years Dick Tierney had been awarded the Outstanding Fighter Trophy, a feat that no other Mission Bouts competitor had accomplished. This year he was going after his third straight trophy.

But Dame Fate had other ideas. Shortly before Christmas he was involved in an automobile accident, leaving him injured enough to prevent him from competing on tonight's card.

He had won the middleweight class title in the last two years, defeating Hank Angelone in two of the most savage fights seen in this city since pros Packy McFarland and "Red" Robinson went at it, according to Abe Raff. Both scraps were strictly Pier Sixers.

Tonight Aquinas officials are presenting a special trophy to Dick in recognition of his outstanding fighting in the Mission Bouts.

The likeable senior from Blessed Sacrament parish has been a consistent performer on the varsity football squad, is a member of the Varsity Club and has been a home room mission leader.

They Serve Unselfishly

Just as it should be, the deep-throated and high-shrilled cheers you hear tonight will be for the fighters, those young men you see giving so unselfishly of themselves in the squared circle.

But as a great athlete once observed, nobody gets to the top in any field without help. And that is the purpose of this space—to pay tribute to those men who helped to whip these finalists into razor-sharp shape.

You could start anywhere. But let's start with Hunk Vadas. Hunk's the head trainer for the Mission Bouts this year, taking over for Abe Raff who was forced by ill health to an advisory capacity after 17 years of full-time duty.

Vadas is one of those dependable guys so necessary to any athletic program. There are times when you wouldn't believe that Aquinas' official football and boxing coach will soon be 50. He's been seen to mix right in with the athletes to illustrate a point physically.

Father Looby, former moderator of the Mission Bouts, first induced Hunk to work with the school's fight program despite Vadas' protests "to get someone who knows about boxing."

Since Dec. 2, Vadas and his very valuable assistant Al Graham have worked steadily with 87 boys. The almost daily routine has demanded running, skipping, calisthenics, bag-punching and sparring. Anyone who knows Vadas knows he's

a tireless, firm taskmaster. "But did you know," informed Hunk, "that most of these boys wanted to work out so badly that they asked me to keep the gym open on New Year's Day."

Graham, a former great boxer, imparts the ring knowledge to these Aquinas fight fledglings. His specialty is the big bag drill and the straight punch. His son, Al Graham, Jr., formerly fought in the Mission Bouts.

Then there's Jay Stalker and Frank Duggan, both of whom have demonstrated excellent judgment in their decisions and prudence in safeguarding the physical welfare of the boxers. And how about a cheer for Sam Cappa, who takes time out from a busy sporting goods job to serve as referee.

But the praise hasn't ended yet. There's Lou Langie, Jr., who conducts a training program at the Columbus Civic Center and John Bell and Tom Camillaci who both set up gym in their homes, greatly aiding the program.

Chubby Ciravola brought his long ushering experience into focus, channeling thousands of students from classroom to gym in orderly fashion for the elimination.

Ray Miller, Tim Welch, John McMahon and Tom Aleo were invaluable as student managers. And Elmer Thaney, Red Smith, Midge Ackerman and Dr. Michael Crino deserve further bouquets of thanks.

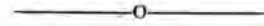
The Hickok Trophy
