## Mission Bout Blows Felt 'Round the World'



FIRST COMMUNION BREAKFAST for children of Mexican Mission at Wharton, Texas, one of many Missions to receive aid from proceeds of tonight's Parade of Pugilists.

When three Aquinas grads last year departed as missionary priests, it further pointed up the tremendous job that school is doing both on the foreign and home fronts.

Latest of the missionary priests from Aquinas, who not too long ago were spectators at the Mission Bouts just as you and I are tonight, were Father Fred J. Kelly (Philippines); Father Malcolm Keenan (Puerto Rico) and Father Tom Brown (Brazil), brother of Bernard Brown, the Arctic priest.

What's it feel like leaving the comfort of one's surroundings and taking off for a mission to one of the world's outposts?

Father Tom Brown explained it recently.

"I am on my way to Brazil and this evening as I watch the scorching tropical sun setting in a cloud of golden dust over the Equator, I can sense again the sudden thrill in being part of a band of Oblate foreign missionaries. We have a tradition of being "specialists in difficult missions." This dates back over a century when our founder, Bishop DeMazened, sent the first Oblates sailing to Africa and Canada and Ceylon.

"Brazil is one of the latest challenges where American Oblates can fulfill their motto 'to preach the Gospel to the poor.' I feel as though I am on the ground floor of this growing new mission even though I am ten years behind the pioneers.

"Our aim and our prayer is that in years to

come we will see our own native Brazilian Oblates being ordained for its fifty million Catholics. The mystery as to what lies ahead for me on this mission has neutralized the sadness I had in leaving the States.

"I'll never forget the day I left home. I felt as though I were boarding Sputnik for outer space. Our missions in Brazil seemed just as remote. As I waved goodbye to mom and dad and drove up Anchor Terrace for the last time until 1962, I realized for the first time what it meant to volunteer for the foreign missions.

"The more I think about it now, the more I realize a missionary priest has no real reason to feel lonely. Just before I came to Brazil, Our Lord was before me on an altar in St. Patrick's Cathedral. He was with me again on the ship's cabin altar and He is with me now in some little chapel tucked away in the mountains of Brazil. Besides, I will really never be separated from my family or friends. Their daily prayers will be with me . . . plus the prayers of hundreds of others of you whom I shall never meet on this earth.

Brazil, the Philippines and Puerto Rico are but three of the many places where Mission Bouts proceeds are sent.

Other missionary beneficiaries are based at Mexico, the Mexican Missions in Texas, Canada, Formosa, India, Pakistan, Africa, China, Dominican Republic, France.

Carmen Basilio is more than just an idol of most Aquinas Mission Bouts fighters. He's one of the guiding forces behind their rigid training program. Whether he holds the title or not, Carmen always rates high with these boys.

You see, Carmen is an old friend and frequent visitor to the Mission Bouts. And on those rare occasions when he can't show up, the fighters realize it must be for some good reason.

But in most recent years he has been able to keep a date with the finals. And if you watch him closely, you'll see him work hard at his position as guest of honor.

He will duck into the dressing room, talk to the fighters, give them pointers and confidence. Long after the crowd has left, he will be signing autographs.

Hunk Vadas, head trainer for the Mission Bouts, has a deep impression of Basilio's sincerity in wanting to spend time with the youngsters.

When they know a man of Basilio's stature is interested in what they do, it means a lot to young

pugilists, many of whom are climbing into the ring for their first finals.

It's not mere coincidence that half of tonight's finalists have named Carmen as their sports idol. They look to him as a fine example in and out of the ring. His determination in the training grind before a big fight sustains them in their own training. Carmen's story of making it the hard way is a well-known one. Mission Bouts fighters figure if they stick to it, they may make it, too.

Father John Wilson, moderator of the Mission Bouts, sums it up best: "Carmen always has been wonderful to all of us. He's an exemplary Catholic, and I don't just mean one who blesses himself in the corner of a ring before a fight"

From atomic weight to heavyweight . . . 135 eager-faced, hard-working young boxers, all looking as dedicated as Carmen Basilio getting ready for a championship fight. Only 12 of all these 135 scrappers will be crowned champions tonight; still each in his own way had a part in tonight's event.

This, in capsule description, is part of the picture of the Aquinas Mission Bouts, which over 20 years have contributed more than a quarter of a million dollars to Catholic Mission colonies.

Beneficiaries of the Missions have spanned from Africa to China. In between have been colonies in Brazil, Mexico, Texas, France, the Phillippines and Formosa.

So much for money talk. Hunk Vadas, who for the second year was in charge of whipping these yearling fighters into shape, likes to tell about another side of the Missions—what good it does for the boys who fight.

"These bouts really make men out of boys," Hunk says. "I think that's the real satisfaction I see in my work with the kids. You see 'em come in here cocky, but when they get sloughed a few times, they calm right down.

"We've noticed at Aquinas that the boys who fight in the Mission Bouts are among the best be-

haved in the school. And that goes for after they graduate, too. When a boy knows how to fight, knows how to protect himself, he doesn't have to be one of those loud-mouthed wise guys going around with a chip on his shoulder. We get less trouble from the Mission Bouts fighters than any of the others. These boys know they can fight. They don't have to prove it.

Helping Vadas with the training were Abe Raff, Sam Cappa, Al Graham, Tom Camillaci and Jim Jordan, C.S.B. Scholastic. Mission Bouts candidates were put through a regular routine of calisthenics, bag punching, rope skipping, road work and sparring.

There are others, too, who deserve credit for making the Mission Bouts among the finest annual events on the city's sports calendar.

Referees Abe Raff and Sam Cappa take time from their business to help out. Judges Jay Stalker, and Frank Duggan do likewise. There's Joe Camillaci who greatly aided the train-program as did John Bell.

"Chub" Ciravola for the umpteenth time brought his long and useful ushering experience into focus and kept the crowd orderly during the elimination rounds.

"Hunk" Vadas

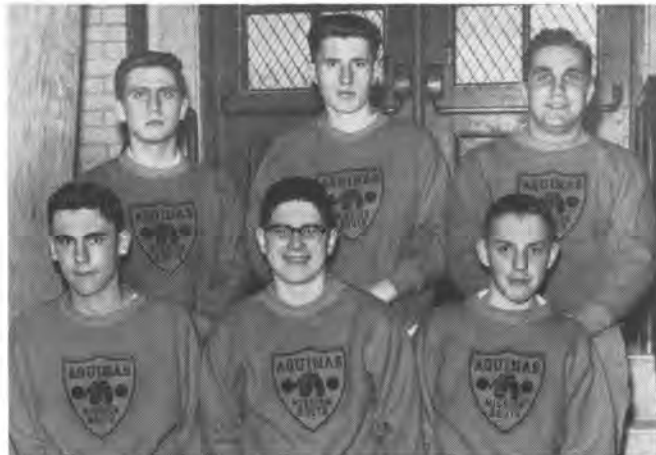
"Hunk" Vadas has to rank among the greatest unsung heroes in the history of Aquinas athletics.
